





steps to study abroad

Attending a study abroad infosession is your first step to learning more about the available programs, application process, financial aid and more.

ATTEND A STUDY ABROAD INFOSESSION

Sessions are held every Monday-Thursday at 4 p.m. in the Office of International Programs, Memorial Union 116.

RESEARCH POTENTIAL PROGRAMS

Attend information sessions, consult education abroad guides, browse the study abroad library, talk with study abroad alumni and explore the study abroad website. Schedule an appointment with the Study Abroad Adviser.

MEET WITH YOUR ACADEMIC ADVISER

Consult with your adviser about which programs will best fit your academic and career plans. Discuss the best term to go abroad (summer, fall, spring or academic year).

SELECT A PROGRAM AND APPLY

You may choose an NDSU program or a non-NDSU program sponsored by any other accredited university or provider. Locate the program on the Study Abroad website and click "Apply Now" to begin the application process.

DEADLINES

MOST PROGRAMS

- October 1 for spring
- March 1 for summer, academic year and fall

ISEP EXCHANGE

- August 20 for spring
- January 20 for academic year and fall
- Summer deadlines vary, but final deadline is March 1.

NDSU FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS

Deadlines vary; see website for information.

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum eligibility requirements: 2.5 GPA and be in good academic and behavioral standing.

Courses are available in English, even in most non-English speaking countries.

Any major is eligible to study abroad. Check with your department to determine the best time and length to go abroad. Programs lengths range from as few as 10 days up to a year.

PARTICIPATION PROCEDURES

Attend mandatory pre-departure orientation sessions; apply for necessary documents (passport, visa); arrange financial matters; obtain course approvals; and make travel arrangements.



financial aid and alternative loans

Students enrolled in a study abroad program can use current financial aid toward their program costs. Since program costs vary for each program, students will work with their study abroad adviser to determine a budget and then meet with a financial aid counselor to discuss aid and alternative loan options.

scholarships

Students are highly encouraged to apply for study abroad scholarships. Keep in mind most scholarship deadlines fall between November to April for study abroad conducted during the next academic year.

NDSU STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIPS

John and Susan Wold International Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded annually for a summer, semester or year of study abroad. Students attending faculty-led programs are encouraged to apply. Preference is given to students who are North Dakota or Minnesota residents. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher.

PROGRAM OPTIONS

EXCHANGE (NDSU AND ISEP)

Exchange programs are universities that NDSU and ISEP have partnerships with where students pay the same tuition and fees as the term at NDSU. ISEP exchange includes housing and meal costs based on NDSU rates. Students attending NDSU exchange programs pay housing and meal costs on site.

■ DIRECT (NDSU AND ISEP)

Direct programs are partner universities students attend while paying host university tuition. NDSU tuition is waived; students are responsible for a small amount of student fees. Housing and meal costs are paid on site.

FACULTY-LED

Students are taught by NDSU faculty and are responsible for NDSU tuition and fees. Other program costs associated with participation vary, but may include airfare, housing, meals, international health insurance and faculty leader costs.

AFFILIATE

Affiliate providers are pre-approved, third-party, study abroad program providers. Students pay the provider program fees which vary and may include tuition, housing, meals, health insurance and excursions. NDSU tuition is waived; students are responsible for a small amount of student fees.


